

SANTA TERESA WOMEN'S GOLF CLUB
GENERAL MEETING March 29, 2018

Captain Barbara Hiura called the meeting to order at 1:10 P.M. She noted the January Captain's Trophy winner was Kelly Shinn with 101-32-69, February's winner was Slue Treleaven with 80-16-65, and March's winner was Carol Shields with 89-26-63. Break 90 pins were presented to Joyce Han for a score of 89 on January 11 and Carol Shields with an 89 on March 8.

SECRETARY: Regarding reading of the minutes for December 8, 2017, Megan Lovelace moved that they be waived, Peggy Fischer seconded and the motion was carried.

CANCER CARE POINT TOURNAMENT: Cathy Priest introduced Ariane Chappie from Cancer Care Point who discussed the many ways that that organization benefits cancer patients. Cathy will be hosting the annual Cancer Care Point Fund-Raising Tournament to be held on April 19, 2018. This will be the 12th year for this annual tournament. She asked that all players wear something pink and that raffle donations would be gratefully accepted. Pictures will be taken.

TREASURER: Deanna Griffin presented the Treasurer's Report, noting that the checkbook balance as of today was \$8,477.00 (see attached). She said that the audit of the 2017 books done by Jan Hew, Namie Takatsuka and Diana Sakamoto was found to be in order. Joan Takemoto moved that the treasurer's report be approved, Terri Parnello seconded it and the motion was carried.

CO-CAPTAIN AND MEMBERSHIP: Jan Hew introduced new members Nancy Cutler, Kim Hull, Sharon Curb, Julie Carlson, Lorraine Chew and Debbie Marti. She said that there were 114 members including 7 honorary members and 4 associates. Red golf bags (for balls, tees, markers, etc.) were awarded to 20-year members Deanna Griffin, Ann Kusumoto, Mary Myahara and Ingrid Sander. These recognition bags will be awarded to future 20-year members.

TOURNAMENT: Marge Condensa said that so far everyone is able to play including those on the waiting list. She asked that everyone be diligent in cancelling at the earliest time so that others can use that tee time. The membership was informed that the Pro Shop computer was hacked last month, but we are assured that there is no impact on our information. Sweeps have been re-entered and is now up to date.

Diana Sakamoto said that Partner Match Play Tournament will be held on June 14 and 21. There should be no more than a 7-stroke differential. Sign-ups can still be done until May 31. Diana said that Team Play is about to begin with a large group. Emails will be coming out soon to the players for scheduling. She cautioned that rounds must be finished in 5 hours after which the remaining holes will be halved. She also asked that players be respectful to the marshals. There may be extra play at Boulder Ridge on August 6 for the end of team play. The President's Cup will be on April 9.

HANDICAP: Marie LeBlanc said that all are doing well in posting their scores.

P.W.G.A: Dora Moutafian sent a report in her absence. The report states that PWGA play days and tournaments have been printed in the Newsletter and will be posted on the bulletin board. She will be emailing monthly reminders to the members prior to each event. PWGA Team Play Championship will be September 11 and 12 in Stockton area at Castle Oaks Golf Course. There is one team that is signed up to represent STWGC in the Qualifying Tournament on July 16 at Crazy Horse Ranch in Salinas. If there

is more than one team that would like to qualify for the Championship, there will be a qualifying tournament at Santa Teresa. If anyone would like to form a team, notification must be made by April 1, 2018. A \$20.00 rebate will be made to anyone with more than one membership with a PWGA Club. The form must be submitted online. We will need the STWGC Club #53-21061.

RULES: Sue Treleven reminded us that pace of play is important. She decided to rescind her motion to implement a ball near root local rule as written in the newsletter and treat it as an unplayable lie, a stroke penalty if the ball is moved. On holes 12 and 18, a ball landing in the tree bark may be moved to the nearest point of relief with no penalty. If a player on the green accidentally moves or unintentionally hits her ball on the green, the ball must be replaced with no penalty.

NEWSLETTER EDITOR: Barbara said that Megan Lovelace is doing a great job as newsletter editor.

SOCIAL: Mary Wond discussed the Christmas Banquet for 2019 and the 50th Anniversary Party. She and Grace Wada researched several different venues (see attached) for a Thursday, rather than Friday as it has been in the past. It was concluded that the best deal is probably to stay at The Villages on a Friday, as before. Unfortunately, the members who are still working might not be able to attend on a Friday. Marie LeBlanc moved that we stay at The Villages for 2019, Cathy Priest seconded it and the motion was carried. We are already committed to having our Luncheon at The Villages in 2018.

MEMBER AT LARGE: Renee Perry was absent.

STARTERS AND SCORERS: Gwen Aso said that the new check-in system seems to be working well.

COMMITTEES: Peggy Fischer said that this is the second week of the individual eclectic. The ec has been extended until May 10. Pat Baldovi reported that Super Guest Day will be September 20, 2018. The theme will be Wahines on the Green (see attached). Donations for raffle prizes will be gratefully accepted. The fee is yet to be determined. Sunshine Felicia Angeles asked that we telephone her with notifications since her computer is down. She said that Karen Buesing wants to play again after cancer remission.

NEW BUSINESS: Barbara said that as our field expands with our new players, those playing towards the end of the field are experiencing an over five-hour round. For them and especially those who tee off early, please keep up with the group in front and play ready golf. She asked that Jan LaFetra and Joan Takemoto print up a photo book of our membership since we now have 21 new members. The answer was an affirmative, but Joan noted that there were many photo holes to fill before an attempt can be made.

Barbara felt that a review of our signing up procedures should be made, since there seems to be a waiting list frequently. Members may not sign up until a sign-up sheet has been placed on the Starter's Table on a regular play day. Members may sign up only for herself, except on Guest Days, when she may sign for her foursome. She may bring one guest. Members not playing that day may get a starting time after all members playing that day have teed off by

1. Telephoning the Pro Shop.
2. Coming to the Pro Shop.
3. Having a member sign for her after that member has finished her round of play.

Cancellations must be made before 7:00 A.M. on the morning of play. Associate members may call for tee times beginning 10 days prior to the Thursday's play day. In case of rain or other conditions in which

play may be questionable, the tournament chair may cancel the tournament for the day. Members may determine the status of the tournament by calling the Pro Shop. Starters and scorers will be given game credit for the day but will not need to be at the cub. Members wishing to play will be given game credit provided they post their scores and notify the Membership chair.

Gena Gordon moved that the meeting be adjourned, Gwen Aso seconded it and the motion was carried. The meeting was adjourned at 2:45 P.M.
